#### Wealth Index, Rules, Ranking

Brad Montgomery provided Dr. Stein "initial reviews, very preliminary draft" on the wealth index. Dr. Stein's report indicated:

- There will be baseline funding in future years.
- As bonded debt is paid off, the surplus funds and given to the Partnership Program.
- Partnership funding lowered from \$260 million to \$57 million, or \$114 million per biennium.
- Ranking process and prioritization discussed
- Dr. Stein looking at 10-year average Wealth Index or average Wealth Index.
- If school district enrollment declines, appears wealthier. If school district enrollment increases, appears less wealthy.
- Wealth Index defined in statute, and applied through Rule which can be changed.
- · Millage funds needed for local share.
- · Excess debt service mills.
- Referenced Representative Charlotte Douglas' suggestion about "carrots".

Dr. Stein arrived at meeting following conflicting meeting, and suggested using wealth index in 2005 or the 10-year average.

Suggestion made to use percentage increase/decrease of enrollment in calculation.

# **Other Business**

Rob Kelly, Kelly Consulting Services

Mr. Kelly participated by teleconference. Kelly Consulting is the vendor who has generated the new facility cost factors annually for last 10 years. Kelly has a step-by-step process to create the report. Explained in detail that he uses a RSM 30-city average cost for all school types and applies adjustment factors and escalates to the mid-point (or July 1) second year of the biennium, reflecting the majority of the state's new facilities' cost factors are now at the \$175 ceiling. The actual cost factor average was \$191.46 across the state.

## Discussion:

- Setting a percentage for each funding category.
- Increase cap only if revisions made to funding amount per project category, otherwise no.
- Increase to \$191 now and setup percentage to adjust annually (increase or decrease).
- One superintendent voiced concern on increasing costs. He built building for \$140 per square foot and thinks \$191 is too high.
- Suggestion to use add a wealth index factor and raise the cap.
- Vote taken to release for bid 11 for, 1 against.

Mr. Montgomery and Mr. Alessi discussed the Program Review RFP.
