Dear Commissioner Key:

In 2015 the 16th National Congress on School Transportation (NCST) met in Des Moines, Iowa to revise and update the National School Transportation Specifications and Procedures (NSTSP; available at www.NCSTOnline.org). Since 1939 the congresses have met every five to ten years to develop and update school bus specifications and operational procedures and guidelines for student transportation. These guidelines, along with federal, state, and local regulations, have resulted in America's school children having the safest, most effective, and reliable transportation in the world, the yellow school bus. The 17th National Congress on School Transportation will convene in Des Moines, Iowa from May 17-20, 2020.

The Congress's procedures specify that the selection of the chairperson for each state's delegation shall be made by the chief state school officer (CSSO) as head of the state education agency, except when leadership of the state's pupil transportation program resides in another agency in which the designated or acting state director of pupil transportation is employed.

Each delegate's employing/sponsoring agency or organization will be responsible for registration and travel costs associated with the Congress. Registration fees are nominal and cover the cost of the Congress, including the associated group meals.

We respectfully request that you appoint your state's director of student transportation or the person serving in that role as State Delegation Chair by July 31, 2019 and confirm the appointment to me (Patrick.McManamon@vermont.gov). I will then contact your designee in August with guidelines on selecting the state's delegation. Each state will be permitted seven delegates, plus alternates as needed. All revisions to the NSTSP are decided by the delegates in parliamentary deliberation during the Congress. Each state delegation is allowed one vote per state on issues discussed.

The NCST Steering Committee is comprised of representatives from national organizations directly involved in student transportation. The sponsoring organizations are the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services (NASDPTS), the National Association for Pupil Transportation (NAPT), the National School Transportation Association (NSTA), and the National Safety Council (NSC). The Steering Committee sets policies, guidelines, and priorities and plans, organizes and conducts the Congress. The sponsoring organizations provide support services to the Steering Committee and the Congress.

Writing committee membership is made up of individuals who represent all segments of student transportation and all regions of the country.
